ED CORRIGAN

CPI, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. Ed has over 25 years of leadership experience on Capitol Hill and in the conservative movement. In 2009, GQ magazine named Corrigan to its list of “50 Most Powerful People in DC.” He led the personnel selection process for all domestic policy departments during the Trump transition, placing hundreds of conservatives in key administrative positions. He serves on the board of the Leadership Institute. He was executive director of the Senate Steering Committee, the caucus of conservative senators, under two chairmen – Senator Jim DeMint (R-SC) and Senator Jeff Sessions (R-AL). He has also worked for Senators Mike Lee (R-UT), Jesse Helms (R-NC), and Bob Smith (R-NH). In 2013, Corrigan was named Heritage Foundation’s group vice president for policy promotion, which worked to advance conservative policy on Capitol Hill and in the conservative movement. CPI, SENIOR DIRECTOR OF POLICY & PROGRAMS. Rachel has over a decade of experience fighting for conservative policies in Washington. She served in both the House and Senate including as legislative director for Senator Rand Paul. Bovard went on to serve as policy director for the Senate Steering Committee under the successive chairmanships of Senator Pat Toomey (R-PA) and Senator Mike Lee (R-UT). In the House, she worked as senior legislative assistant to Congressman Donald Manzullo (R-IL), and Congressman Ted Poe (R-TX). She also served as director of policy services for The Heritage Foundation. In 2013, she was named one of National Journal’s Most Influential Women in Washington under 35. In addition to her public policy pursuits, Bovard is an accomplished sommelier, a wine educator, and a diploma candidate in the Wine & Spirit Education Trust. She lives with her rescue puppy, Chloe, on Capitol Hill.
